## Safety Team Report

- Bad News
  - Limited patrol hours due to staffing shortages
  - No expected relief in 2024 season
- Good News
  - Relative safe Summer season one boat rescue overturned boat
  - No fatalities / no near drownings
- Old news
  - 44 Students in 2023 boater safety class / 11 from Lake Geneva Safety Patrol
  - Boater's Safety certificate needed to rent boats in Wisconsin regardless of age

## **Barley Straw**

- The program is being implemented with the approval and oversight of the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources.
- As the straw decomposes in its bag, it releases a natural chemical which inhibits algae growth.
- Not known to have toxic effects on rooted aquatic plants, zooplankton, insect larvae or fish.
- It is a cost-effective and environmentally acceptable way to control algae in ponds and lakes.
- Water samples sent to Madison for analysis

## **Bog Harvesting**

- 1<sup>st</sup> bog appeared in late June, earliest ever
- Other bogs did not rise until August
- 2<sup>nd</sup> 10 year permit ends this year
- Brandon Riese applying for future permit and will do our dredging
- Due to new DNR staff and rules September may not be met

## Weed Harvesting

- Hired 'in-house' team: 2 supervisors, 5 operators
  - Aquarius serviced and launched equipment, trained employees
  - Operate Mon. to Thurs., weed pickup Mon.
- DNR granted 5-year harvesting permit (through 2027)
- Light year for weeds, primarily curly leaf pondweed
- Priorities going forward:
  - Retaining crew for next summer
  - Buying land for pole barn (2+ acres)
  - Storing equipment indoors for winter
  - Mechanical harvesting vs. chemical treatment

## Land Acquisition

- Strategically important for Lake Management District
  - Preservation of equipment (\$2 Million+ replacement value)
  - Home base for operations: tool storage, maintenance, power washing
  - Year-to-year continuity
  - Not subject to rising rental rates
  - Board able to focus on other priorities
- Implementation Plan:
  - Buy 2+ acres with/for pole barn (60x100 minimum)
  - Relatively flat land, relatively close to lake
  - Pursuing leads, contacting landowners
  - Financing available from First Citizens

## Land Acquisition

Land & Improvement Financing Assumptions:

- James Caldwell, CEO of First Citizen State Bank has given us verbal commit for financing at the best rate available for a municipality
- Current rates at 7.25% Interest
- 20 Year amortization with two ten-year terms the limit for municipalities
- 20% down payment at each loan initiation, first for Land then Improvements
- For Budget purposes, assuming a land acquisition of \$220,000 in 2024 and improvements of \$200,000 in 2025, this would equate to the following:
  ▶ 20% down payment of \$44,000 in 2024 and \$40,000 in 2025
  ▶ Annual Principal & Interest cost of \$30,277 for Land & Improvements
- All Land Acquisition costs will be funded through the Capital Reserve
- Costs will not increase the Tax Assessment

## Equipment Update

- Received a \$134,950 (50%) award from the Wisconsin Waterways Commission
- Delivery of a new 7' Aquatic Plant Harvester and Trailer is not likely until the 2025 Harvesting Season
- Purchased a new Tool/Equipment Cargo Trailer to house small power equipment, hand tools and operating supplies
- Future equipment to be purchased from the 5-Year Capital Plan as outlined


