The board discussed weed spraying for next summer. Wildi made a motion for shoreline spraying. Butcher seconded it. Unanimous vote followed. Details and procedures for spraying will be determined in the future.

Breidenbach brought up the need for new procedures for dealing with floating weeds.

The board discussed the need to have a member attend the annual WALD meeting on March 13 and 14. Butcher motioned to send representation to this meeting. Breidenbach seconded it. Unanimous in favor.

OTHER BUSINESS

Norris started with a request to create a nominating committee to generate other candidates for the board election this summer. At present, he is considering not running for re-election. He asked Breidenbach to head the committee. Breidenbach accepted.

Norris mentioned a study which stated how powerboats cause higher phosphorous content in the water. This applies to shallow lakes of less than 12 feet. Evidently the lake bottom is stirred

up.

Norris mentioned that Lauderdale Lakes is considering a sewer system around their lakes. He thought that Whitewater Lake would have to look into some sanitary system in the future.

Norris said that two people were interested in being "lake

observers".

Norris said that Bob Wakeman of the DNR said that we should write an aquatic plant management plan for the lakes. This will probably be necessary for us to get additional assistance from the DNR.

Breidenbach again brought up the need for a system or procedure for floating weed removal.

Norris reported on the secci disk readings for Rice Lakes last summer. Water clarity was poor - usually less than 2 feet of visibility.

Norris reported on the 1986 GMC dump truck we purchased. Particulars are: Model C7D0H2, 16' grain body and hoist, 64,000 miles on odometer - 5 speed transmission. VIN #1GDG7DIB4GV515903.

miles on odometer - 5 speed transmission. VIN #1GDG7DIB4GV5I5903. EIN #39-1583143 is our employer I.D. number as reported by John Wildi. He stated that we are exempt from federal and state

income tax liability. 77.549A State statute so states that we are also exempt from state sales tax. Wildi noted that we need to create a purchase order system.

Norris mentioned that we may need a new dump site for the lake

weeds.

Norris mentioned that Phil Starkey would try to remove some of the bogs on the east lobe. With state permission this is worth

looking into.

Norris reported that weed spraying might be best utilized by concentrating in shallower areas. Bob Wakeman of the DNR suggested this according to Norris. Cost per acre is \$147.40 plus \$25/acre in permits. Norris suggested that we spray a 30ft. perimeter from shore with allowance for additional spraying in shallower areas where the harvester can't reach. Areas where riparian owners don't want spraying won't be sprayed. Scharine motioned that we don't spent over \$10,000 on spraying with a 5% variance (\$500) on the top end (\$10,500). Butcher seconded the motion. Unanimous approval.

Bob Benjamin mentioned that there be some conformity of color

He also thought that we should hire temporary help on Mondays and Fridays to assist in the clean-up of floating weeds.

Norris said that if a group of property owners could collectively organize a group effort to push floaters out to the harvester, he would see that the harvester would be there to collect the weeds.

The board decided to cut weeds more than eight hours per day. Norris will approach Roy about this.

The 1993 budget was approved by a hand vote - only 2 opposed.

PUBLIC INPUT/OTHER BUSINESS

Norris discussed equipment storage costs; land purchase \$3,000 - \$15,000 and pole barn costs of about \$20,000. He proposed that the district give the board permission to purchase land for a future storage area.

Burke motioned to purchase property and build a pole barn for storage at this time. Sue Padderson seconded the motion. Discussion ensued as follows:

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- 1. Chairman Norris called the meeting to order at 2:04 p.m. 144 people attended.
 - 2. Norris introduced the board: Mel Scharine, Daryl Butcher, Tom Ponyiscanyi and Rick Breidenbach. He also introduced Russ Jones as acting parliamentarian.
- 3. Norris explained that the meeting would be conducted in accordance with both chapter 33 of Wisconsin statutes and Roberts revised rules of order. He asked that those who wished to speak be courteous and concise and that no new business be brought up after 4:30 p.m.

Mr. Wilson made a motion that any voting on budget and mil rate be done by paper ballot. Mrs. Barbour seconded the motion. A unanimous vote followed in favor of the rules as modified by the Wilson/Barbour motion.

Norris apologized for not having a printed agenda. But he did have it on the blackboard for everyone to see.

4. SECRETARY'S REPORT. Rick Breidenbach asked everyone to read their copy of last year's minutes. He stated that the board would be happy to discuss any individual item of concern.

Mr. Krebs asked a question regarding the mil rate and the vote establishing it at 2.0. Norris explained the motion in the 1989 meeting that changed the mil rate. He also explained the proceedural question raised in the 1990 meeting. At this time Mr. McCarthy motioned to approve the 1991 minutes. Mr. Holland seconded the motion. A unanimous vote followed in favor of accepting the 1991 minutes.

5. TREASURER'S REPORT. Copies were presented to everyone

in attendance. The books were closed as of 8/10/91. Itemized expenditures totalled \$131,656.76. Itemized credits totalled \$97,406.95. Beginning balance was \$40,572.11 leaving an ending balance of \$6,322.30. He thanked Laura Hicks and Ray Heger for auditing the books. Mr. Louie Leone questioned weed harvesting costs. Ponyiscanyi explained that this year we had both harvesting and spraying costs under one heading of weed control. Mr. Leone made a motion to accept this report. Mr. Joe Kiterand seconded the motion. A unanimous vote approved this report.

- 6. Norris explained that assessed property value and mil rate has nothing to do with our budget. The mil rate establishes a ceiling amount. Actual spending and budget amounts will be determined at this meeting.
- 7. NEW OFFICER ELECTION. Norris thanked Tom Ponyiscanyi for his excellent service. Tom is not seeking re-election. Norris also thanked Ray Heger and others for their volunteer help. He asked that others get involved on both Whitewater and Rice lakes.

Both candidates, John Wildi and Muriel Schrock, spoke briefly regarding their candidacy. Voters used their yellow ballot to vote.

- 8. Tom Ponyiscanyi explained the fish stocking program. He regretted not being able to get DNR financial help. He plans to get more involved with the fish management committee in the future. We spent \$5900.00 on fish stocking. 20,000 walleyes were put in Whitewater Lake. northern were put in Whitewater Lake, and 500 northern were put in Rice Lake.
 - 9. Norris explained the U.S.G.S. program. This lake study, which began 1 year ago, is funded with \$40,000 of federal money, \$30,000 state and \$10,000 district. He explained that we had to re-apply for the 2nd year of funding, and it appears we will get the funding.

He explained the various apparatus used to collect data. Year two of the study will cover analysis of the data and will provide a written report of the survey's findings. These findings will be used to create a more detailed management plan for the lakes. Norris noted that the study's findings will be available to residents in about 1 year. Norris also noted that the board wants to keep the lake level monitoring station after the close of the survey. This would cost \$1100/y.

10. WEED CONTROL PROGRAM. Norris explained the shoreline spraying strategy. This was a 30 foot strip around the developed shorelines. This totalled 29 acres on Whitewater Lake and 4 acres on Rice Lake. He stated that the board could have sprayed as much as 64 acres which would have been the maximum amount allowed by the DNR. Norris asked for public input as to the effectiveness of the spraying.

Much discussion concerning spraying followed. Some residents were against any spraying of any kind. More residents were in favor of increased spraying. And most residents appeared to favor a 'two-prong' approach to weed control - that is: both spraying and harvesting.

Regarding harvesting, Norris explained that we took about the same amount of weeds from Whitewater Lake this year as we did last year. Very little was taken from Rice Lake since there was little growth along the developed shoreline. Norris noted that chances were good to significantly deplete the phosphorous content in Whitewater Lake by harvesting over the next few years.

Norris explained that, if we decide to purchase a harvester, D & D Products will redesign and build us a new harvester since we are unhappy with the present machine. Norris asked everyone to look at their hand-out which explained the costs involved.

11. <u>BUDGET</u>. Norris, referring to the blackboard, systematically explained each budget item: Operating

costs - 1200, Newsletter - 900, Legal services - 700, WALD and NLMS - 200, Fish stocking - 3000, Wild Life Rehab. - 500, and Weed Control - 80,000. All items totalled to \$86,500. Norris noted that this was almost the same as last year's budget. Norris asked for a motion to approve the budget.

Ed Coyne moved to approve the budget as described. Walter Lauer seconded the motion.

Some discussion ensued regarding aspects of some specific items. These included: wild life rehab for geese, fish stocking, mil rate and the depreciation of equipment.

Voters were instructed to use the blue ballot to vote on the budget.

The budget passed with 126 voting in favor and 19 voting against.

12. Purchase of Harvesting Equipment. Norris explained the estimated costs of purchasing harvesting equipment. He explained the benefits of owning our own equipment. There was some discussion regarding storage, life expectancy of the harvester and availability of the harvester in May. Insurance and liability costs were also discussed.

Mr. Wegner motioned to purchase a harvester and associated equipment if in the board's judgement it is more economical to own than to rent. Dick Cooney seconded the motion.

More discussion ensued.

LeRoy Roberts moved to ammend the motion to purchase a harvester and associated equipment if it is made available no later than May 15th. Norris asked Wegner if the amended motion was acceptable. He said it was and seconded the new motion.

At this point Norris introduced Jack Dauffenbach to explain and answer questions regarding the harvesting equipment that he builds. He addressed warranties and penalties for late delivery also.

More discussion ensued. This time on liability insurance.

Norris instructed voters to use the pink ballot and vote either yes or no.

The vote was 82 in favor of purchasing harvesting equipment and 59 against purchasing. The motion carried.

- 13. PRESENTATION OF NEW OFFICER. John Wildi was presented as the new commissioner. He received 78 votes. Muriel Schrock received 66.
- 14. NEXT ANNUAL MEETING DATE. Cliff Witte moved to have next year's annual meeting on August 15, 1992. Tom Ponyiscanyi seconded the motion. It carried unanimously.
- 15. PUBLIC INPUT. Al Neere requested the board to address the bog problem. Norris stated he would see if the DNR would give the district help in dealing with the problem.

Walter Hicks thanked Tom Ponyiscanyi for his service on the board.

16. Norris asked for a motion to adjourn. An unknown person so moved and Mr. McCarthy seconded. The motion passed by unanimous voice vote.

The meeting was adjourned about 4:30 p.m.

September 10,1992

Bill Norris opened the meeting at 7:32.

Present: Norris, Butcher, Wildi, Scharine and Breidenbach.

SECRETARY'S REPORT

Copies were sent to each board member. Scharine motioned to accept. Butcher seconded. Unanimous approval.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Copies were given to each board member. Beginning balance was \$61,511.25. Bills paid were \$1,440.86. Income was \$35,804.83. Payroll was \$2,739.00. Ending balance was \$93,406.22. Scharine motioned to accept this report. Breidenbach seconded it. Unanimous approval.

OTHER BUSINESS

Norris hoped that more people will show interest in becoming board members and run for office in the future. Discussion ensued as to how to promote interest in being on the board. Scharine motioned to keep the officers in their present positions. Butcher seconded it. Unanimous approval.

Wildi proposed prepaying \$10,000.00 on our harvesting equipment loan. He estimates that it would save \$200.00/yr. for the next 5 years for a total savings of \$1,000 over the life of the loan. Discussion ensued. Norris moved to prepay \$5,000. Butcher seconded it. Unanimous approval.

Wildi wondered if county land would be available for lease. Scharine noted that no county land would be available for a harvester shed.

Harvesting ended on Aug. 28 since most of the crew returned to college. Norris pointed out that damage was occurring to the harvester belt due to rocks in weed piles that are forked onto the harvester.

Butcher brought up the possibility of having a crew do nothing but pick up weed piles on shore.

Scharine motioned to skip October's meeting due to lack of quorum. Norris seconded. Unanimous approval.

Norris mentioned buying a new motor for the transporter. A special program exists for municipalities. Our cost would be approximately \$1500. Roy Sheehan thought this to be a good idea.

Norris mentioned that we need a truck to pull the maintenance trailer. Ralph Henning has an appropriate truck for sale for \$1600. Presently Roy Sheehan has been pulling the trailer with his personal auto. Butcher motioned to have Roy Sheehan and Vic Schrock explore the possibility of purchasing this truck and checking out the front end alignment. Norris seconded it. Unanimous approval.

Norris explained his efforts to find a suitable piece of land for a pole barn. No viable options exist at this time. The board is going to again look at the Galiretto (?) property.

Norris suggested that the district should rent a safe-deposit box a the branch bank. Butcher motioned to rent a safe-deposit box. Scharine seconded it. Unanimous approval.

Norris pointed out the need to establish an ending date for the fiscal year. It would simplify accounting for weed harvesting expenses at the annual meeting in August. Butcher motioned to change the fiscal year from Jan. 1 to Dec. 31. Norris seconded it. Unanimous approval.

Norris mentioned the need for spraying for curly leaf pondweed. 2-4-D isn't effective against it. We have used 2-4-D for milfoil in the past.

Aug. 21, 1993 is the date for the next annual meeting.

Norris discussed some of the preliminary findings of the U.S.G.S. The final report is due in a few months.

Norris wondered about addressing the bogs. He called the DNR. They sent divers to investigate whether the bogs were attached to the lake bottom. Butcher mentioned the high costs of dredging.

Meeting adjourned at 10:12 P.M.

WHITEWATER - RICE LAKES MANAGEMENT DISTRICT MEETING November 12, 1992

Bill Norris opened the meeting at 7:30. Present: Norris, Scharine, Breidenbach; absent: Wildi and Butcher.

Copies were mailed to each board member. Norris noted a minor change of the word harvester to transporter. With this change the minutes were approved.

Treasurer's Report

A detailed written report was given to each board member. Beginning balance was \$93,406.22. A lengthy itemized list of bills paid was included. Payroll deductions totalled \$2,428.76. Ending balance was \$29,276.72. Treasurer's report was approved.

Other Business

Norris stated that the ram on the dump truck is fixed, and the truck is ready for storage.

Norris mentioned our best secchi disk reading was 11 feet and the worst was 3 feet for Whitewater Lake. Rice Lake's best was 6 1/2 feet, and 1 3/4 feet was the worst.

Norris reported on this year's harvesting program. Percentage of harvested weeds by lake section were:

12.7% - West Lobe, Whitewater Lake

40.4% - East Lobe, Whitewater Lake

43.7% - South Lobe, Whitewater Lake

3.1% - Rice Lake

Details will follow in the newsletter.

Total wages were \$12,325 for harvesting as of 9/1/92. Approximately 1,028 tons of weeds were removed. This amount has decreased significantly the past 3 years. Curlyleaf pondweed has returned to the lake to challenge the milfoil. There is some countail as well.

Norris noted that we can trade in our transporter's outboard for a new one for about \$2600.00 at Frank's Marina.

Norris stated that the district has rented a safety deposit box at the branch bank. The box number is 105. Norris and Wildi have keys to the box. The contents are the truck's title and registration and the 2 trailers' titles.

At this point, a suitable piece of property for a pole barn

has not been found. Building on township property near the Whitewater Town Hall is a possibility. Whitewater township is waiting for its annual meeting to tell us if this is possible.

Norris said that the DNR observer for the weed spraying operation will make 'on the spot' decisions as to 'what' and 'how much' should be sprayed. Diquot controls both milfoil and curlyleaf. It is expensive. 2-4-D handles milfoil and Aquathol K handles curlyleaf. We may have to spray twice - once for curlyleaf and once for milfoil. This would be quite costly. Perhaps as much as \$16,000.

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Meeting adjourned at 9:42 P.M.

Weed spraying was discussed at length, as were launch fees and speed limits.
